Kyle City Council adopted the Storm Drainage and Flood Risk Mitigation Utility Ordinance. It includes a storm drainage fee, allowing the city to start addressing future flooding and maintain our existing infrastructure and design. It will also help the city install new infrastructure so we can focus on stormwater issues and a backlog of drainage projects.
