New Shade at the Lake Kyle Park Inclusive Playground


- We're excited to announce the addition of a new shade structure over the inclusive playground at Lake Kyle!

FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank & Pump Station:

- Progress continues on the installation of the 36-inch pipe.
- PEC onsite to install temporary power to the site.
- AT&T construction schedule is dependent on the coordination with Union Pacific. Approval of the plans and coordination is ongoing.
- Full onsite mobilization of preload is pushed to August 26.
 The final completion date is not affected.
- Archer Western work schedule 7am-5:30pm, Monday - Friday.

- Entry level floor poured.
- Welded steel tank crew to be on site next week.
- Tank at grade work scheduled from August 28-October 22.

MicroSurfacing w/Viking Construction:

- The remainder of the streets are in progress and should be completed by August 21.
- Striping is planned for August 23.




Our heartfelt congratulations to the lucky winners of the bike raffle!
